Program: Bob Steele Chasing Spring on the Pacific Crest Trail


In 2016 Bob and his wife Susan thru-hiked the 2650 mile-long Pacific Crest Trail with one different goal for the trail than anyone else – counting all the birds. Their trek passed through magnificent scenery, diverse habitats, and afforded the chance to see birds moving northbound, from spring migration to summer breeding.

With technically stunning photography and storytelling, this evening presentation will take you along the mountainous spine of the west coast, winding from Mexico to Canada with a keen eye toward natural history and birds. Share in the joy and challenge of backpacking 140 days on one of the most famous trails in the Western Hemisphere, and glimpse some of the 200 species of birds found along the way.

Join us at the Maturango Museum at 7pm on May 18th. It's our annual meeting, so there will be cookies.

2 **California Scrub-Jays** continued at a yard NW of Inyokern at least through Mar 4 (LB).

9 American Robins at a yard in NW Ridgecrest Mar 1 was the highest total ever for that location (BBu, DBu).

4 **Le Conte's Thrashers** (adult feeding 3 fledgelings on the ground) NW of Inyokern Mar 23 (BB, EH, LK, FO, LP, DT, LW).

A **Phainopepla** at a yard one mile below the college on Mar 15 (DW).

IWV FOS - **Bonaparte's Gull at** CLP Mar 14 (BSt, SSt); **Lesser Nighthawk** at an E Ridgecrest yard Mar 29 (LSu, SSu), **Western Kingbird** at RWWP Mar 18 (LSu, SSu),

# BIRD KILLERS

PIPES AND WINDOWS

We have run a couple of articles with horrible pictures of dead birds in open pipes. I won't do that again unless there's tons of space to fill in a newsletter; however, it is definitely time to re-raise the issue. I noticed on the way to WalMart the other day that at least half the caps on the posts of the chain-link fence along Bowman Road have blown off or been pilfered. I plan to measure those for size, then buy caps to cover them. (I will hope to be reimbursed by Kerncrest, and to establish a fund for that purpose.)

Please try to notice open pipes as you drive around your neighborhoods and report them to Brenda at 760-382-4935. Also call me if you would like to help. Flycatcher migration is almost upon us, and those birds are the most likely to be trapped in open pipes!

Windows are another killer of birds, especially for those of us who feed them in our yards. Many of us have tried several supposed solutions to the problem of bird strikes, to no avail. Bob Steele has finally found for us a solution that works. They're made of parachute cord, and you can buy them or make your own. See <u>https://www.birdsavers.com/factsheet.html</u> for options and links to instructions.
