BIRDATHON

In the past, the practice has been to publish the list of birds seen at the annual Birdathon in a separate letter, issued only to those who contributed to the Birdathon, sort of as a "bribe." This practice has been discontinued for the past two years and is not likely to be re-instituted. We realize that people regularly contribute as much as they are able, and should not be excluded from reading about the event because of an inability to contribute.

So the list of birds seen can be found on page 3 of this issue.

As for news of the birdathon itself, it was a very strange one. Spring seems to be late this year. Although the date was only 2 days earlier than the birdathon of 2008, species seen were more winter than migrating. We still had snow geese, and there were almost NO WARBI FRS in the valley. Fortunately, two teams hinded

the Kern River valley and came through with warblers, and more flycatchers than usual. And we almost didn't get a horned lark! We know they're here, but they seem to be dispersed, breeding, and being very, very quiet.

As always, there were some frustrating misses. A male sora was seen in Heritage Village the day before the birdathon but was not spotted on the search. Same for a Canada goose, and a flock of Lesser Nighthawks.

Another reason for the low species count this year was likely the fact that our two best birders were gallivanting around Colorado looking for sage grouse. So we hope that those of you who contribute "per species" will take pity on us and up your pledge per species.

It's still not too late to contribute, of course. You can still mail contributions to PO Box 984. Half of the proceeds go to the Kern River Preserve in Weldon, and the other half to support our education programs here in Ridgecrest, which include 2 Junior Audubon clubs at local schools and a beginning birding class at the library.

RIDGECREST SOLAR PROJECT INTERVENTION REPORT

The Kerncrest Audubon Society (KAS) has intervened in the permitting process for Solar Millennium, LLC, Ridgecrest solar power generating project.

A workshop was held in Ridgecrest by the California Energy Commission (CEC) staff to settle as many issues as possible that remain between the CEC and Solar Millennium. California Law requires that such issues be resolved publicly. KAS participated in this workshop and several members of KAS were present as part of the public during the workshop.

As of the end of the workshop the only major issues remaining "unsettled" or unmitigated are the visual impact and the biological issues. The CEC Staff is opposing the project at this site because the site is a uniquely rich and diverse habitat that should be protected from development. KAS supports the CEC Staff in this conclusion. Other mitigations (water, air, socioeconomic, health, etc.) have been agreed upon in principle, between CEC staff and the applicant. KAS may offer additional mitigations in some of these areas where we feel the present mitigations are not adequate.

Terri Middlemiss, Brenda Burnett and Dan Burnett are the KAS board members working on this issue.

Valley Sightings April 2010

The two lingering **Snow Geese** continued at the old sewage ponds on Apr 3 (DBu).

The **Mallard x Gadwall** hybrid was at the ponds Apr 6 and 8-9, and a **Blue-winged X Cinnamon Teal** hybrid was seen Apr 7 (SLS).

The female **Common Goldeneye** at the ponds was last seen Apr 1 (SLS).

A **Red-breasted Merganser** was at the ponds Apr 11-12 (SLS).

The **Common Loons** at the ponds Apr 1 and 11 were in gorgeous breeding plumage (SLS).

An **Osprey** was at the golf course Apr 1 (SLS).

This year's confirmation of **Cooper's Hawks** nesting at the college came on Apr 12 when the female was seen sitting on the nest (BB).

Seven **Swainson's Hawks** streamed north out of Ridgecrest the morning of Apr 9 (SLS, BS). Our previous high count for the species was two, and they were last noted in the valley April 22, 2007. Two other **Swainson's Hawks** were seen on Apr 12 one at the ponds (SS) and the other in Sand Canyon (LS, BP). The hawk in Sand Canyon was species #148 for that location.

A **Merlin** was at the ponds Apr 13 and a **Peregrine Falcon** was seen the following day (SLS).

FOS for **Semipalmated Plover** was from the ponds Apr 12 (BB).

FOS for **Western Sandpiper** was from the ponds Apr 11 and **Willet** Apr 12 (SLS).

FOS for **Bonaparte's Gull** was from the ponds Apr 13 (SLS).

FOS for **Caspian Tern** was at the ponds Apr 12 (SLS).

While it is an unusual location, it is the second time a **Virginia's Rail** has been found in Indian Wells Canyon (L&SSu). This sighting was on Apr 8, the previous by one of our current reporters was on March 27, 2006.

FOS for **Snowy Plover** and **Long-billed Curlew** (SLS) and **Whimbrel** (BB) was from the ponds Apr 8.

A **Calliope Hummingbird** was in Ridgecrest Apr 5 (JAS).

The **Belted Kingfishers** at the ponds Apr 8-9 and 14 were nicely in the middle of their expected migration window (SLS).

A **Red-breasted Sapsucker** was N of Inyokern Apr 1-6 (TM). This is a new last spring sighting date, with the old date being March 22.

FOS for **Gray Flycatcher** was from Indian Wells Canyon Apr 8 (L&SSu).

Dusky and **Pacific-slope Flycatcher** FOS sightings were from Sand Canyon Apr 12 (LS, BP).

A **Vermillion Flycatcher** was on the base Apr 12 (SLS).

FOS for **Cassin's Vireo** was from S of Inyokern Apr 11 (SLS).

The first **Bank Swallow** of the spring was at the ponds Apr 5 (SLS).

A **Hermit Thrush** was in SE Ridgecrest Apr 5-6 (SB).

The first **House Wren** of the spring was from SE Ridgecrest Apr 9 (SB). Eighteen! **House Wrens** were found at the college Apr 12 (BB). Our previous high count was a paltry four.

Two eggs were noted in the 2nd **LeConte's Thrasher** nest of the year Apr 6 (LK). The first nest successfully fledged three young.

FOS for **Black-throated Gray Warbler** was from the college Apr 10 (JAS).

The first **Townsend's Warbler** this spring arrived in Ridgecrest Apr 9 (DBu). This is near the early end of their local migration, April 7, and we should expect to see them through the end of May.

The first **Wilson's Warbler** of the spring was from Sand Canyon Apr 12 (LS, BP).

A **Fox Sparrow** was S of Inyokern Apr 1 (SLS).

FOS for **Lazuli Bunting** was from Sand Canyon Apr 12 (DBu, LL).

After getting off to a slow start, **Bullock's** and **Hooded Orioles** are now being regularly seen (m.ob).

A **Pine Siskin** was S of Inyokern Apr 13 (SLS).

Lawrence's Goldfinch continue at the college being noted on Apr 10 (JAS) and Apr 12 (BB), others were S of Inyokern Apr 9 -13 and on the base Apr 12-13 (SLS).
