FIELD TRIP Breakfast at Cerro Coso

On October 19, we will meet at Cerro Coso College with breakfasts in hand at 8:00 AM at the dirt parking area just beyond the campus at the south end of College Heights Blvd. There is seating for 8 at a picnic table there. Please call Bob Parker at 760-446-2001 and let him know you plan to attend. If numbers exceed 8, (and we hope they will) we will bring extra chairs for attendees. When our tummies are full, we will proceed to check out the birds in and around the College.

Note this is a fun one for families and beginning birdwatchers. So if 8:00 AM is too early, just come on and join us a bit later. We'll walk around the campus, and if we run out of birds there will proceed to the Watchable Wildlife area on County Line Road behind the Ridgecrest Animal Shelter.

If the turnout is large, we may split into groups; however, our experience at previous beginning bird walks showed spacing not to be a problem. Birders, as a species, tend not to bunch up.

Bring a picnic, and wear clothing appropriate to the weather. Extra binoculars will be available for those who need them.

TRIP REPORT

Little Lake Overlook and nearby areas

Long ago, Kerncrest Audubon Society partipated with the Ridgecrest field office of the Bureau of Land Management (BLM) to establish a Watchable Wildlife Area at a patch of BLM land overlooking Little Lake. On September 21st, we had a terrific trip there with the attendance of a couple of Melanie Branson's BHS Environmental Club: President, Ethan Hardy and the Vice President Iriza Katsuya, who vastly enjoyed their first-ever bird watching trip. They were amazed to see an osprey catching fish, a Great Blue Heron eat a large frog and over 900 American Coots.

There were also a Great Egret, Perigrine Falcon, Northern Harrier, and several species of ducks.

One outcome of the trip was that those of us who participated in the original purchase of signs at the overlook information area noticed that the signs are weathered to the point of being illegible. We are now working with the BLM to duplicate the information on the original signs and make new ones, hopefully with more sun-resistance.

Burrowing Owl Volunteer Days at Hanning Flat October 12-13 and October 19-20. 8 a.m. - 2 p.m.

The Kern River Valley Heritage Foundation will be constructing 10 new artificial burrows for burrowing owls. Over the past few years, volunteers have helped construct 15 burrows, some of which were used within days of their completion! This year we were rewarded with a mating pair that stayed all winter and produced a family of 7 owlets in May! Please bring a hat, gloves, water, lunch, a chair and a shovel.
